

Recently, ballot drop boxes have been a common subject of misinformation and misconception. As such, it's important for elections officials to be well acquainted with the rules and policies around dropbox observation.

This generic, nonpartisan resource includes operational response best practices for engaging with dropbox observers, as well as starter templates for <u>social media</u>, <u>news releases</u>, and <u>voter-facing information</u>. These can be easily adapted for any election office and provide a starting place for nonpartisan communication with voters about drop box observers. Keep in mind, these are just samples and guides. We encourage you to adapt them to your jurisdiction's needs and make them your own. We encourage you to consult your state, county, or city attorney about relevant statutes.

Operational Response Best Practices

This Operational Response Template outlines steps that election officials can take to proactively manage conversations around drop boxes and to navigate issues should they arise. These guidelines are based on best practices, and are organized based on the situation and audience.

Planning Phase	Steps to Consider
Preparation	 Training Staff and Developing Protocols Legal Training: Ensure all staff are knowledgeable about state and local laws regarding ballot drop box monitoring and voter intimidation. Incident Response Training: Conduct regular training on de-escalation techniques and how to handle confrontational situations. Include role-playing exercises to help staff practice responses. Resource Availability: Ensure staff have access to relevant resources, such as quick reference guides to laws, contact lists, and incident report forms. Develop Protocols: Develop and distribute clear, written protocols for how to respond to overzealous observers, including step-by-step instructions for different types of situations. This document can be used as a starting point. Communication with Law Enforcement Pre-Election Coordination: Schedule meetings with local law enforcement before the election to discuss potential issues and establish a clear communication plan. Emergency Contacts: Create a list of emergency contacts within law enforcement, ensuring that all staff have this information readily available. Joint Training: Consider joint training sessions with law enforcement to ensure a coordinated response to any incidents. Develop and Share Observer Guidelines Visible Signage: Place signs at all ballot drop box locations clearly stating the rules for observers, including distance requirements and prohibited behaviors. Handouts: Provide printed guidelines to observers who arrive at ballot drop box locations, outlining their rights and responsibilities. Online: rules and guidelines should also be posted on the official elections website
Communicating with Observers	Always communicate in a calm and respectful manner, regardless of the observer's behavior. Use clear and straightforward language to avoid misunderstandings.

Managing Drop Box Observers Operational Best Practices



This Operational Response Template outlines steps that election officials can take to proactively manage conversations around dropboxes and to navigate issues should they arise. These guidelines are based on best practices, and are organized based on the situation and audience.

Planning Phase	Steps to Consider
	 Template Scripts Initial Interaction: "Hello, I see that you are observing the ballot drop box. Please ensure that you are following all guidelines for observers. If you have any concerns, you can report them to our office. Thank you for your cooperation." Addressing Non-Compliance: "We understand your interest in the election process. However, we must ask you to follow the observer guidelines to ensure the safety and integrity of the voting process. Failure to comply may result in your removal from this area." Escalation Warning: "We have noticed that your current behavior is disruptive. If you do not comply with the guidelines, we will need to contact law enforcement to ensure the safety of all voters and staff."
Communicating with Voters	 Pre-Election Communication News Releases: Issue news releases outlining the rules for ballot drop box observers and the measures in place to ensure a fair and safe election process. Include information about the importance of following these guidelines. Social Media Posts: Use social media to remind the public of their rights and responsibilities regarding ballot drop boxes. Share clear, concise posts about the rules for observers and how to report concerns. Community Outreach: Engage with community organizations, local leaders, and influencers to spread the word about proper ballot drop box etiquette and the role of observers. During the Election Regular Updates: Provide regular updates on the status of ballot drop box monitoring through news releases, social media, and the official election website. Address any incidents promptly and transparently. Incident Reporting: Encourage the public to report any concerning behavior they witness around ballot drop boxes. Provide clear instructions on how to report issues and reassure the public that their concerns will be taken seriously. Hotline Availability: Establish a hotline for voters to call if they encounter problems or have questions about ballot drop box observers. Ensure the hotline is well-publicized and staffed by knowledgeable personnel.
Media Engagement	 Communicate Proactively: Reach out to local media outlets before the election to discuss the measures in place for ballot drop box security and observer guidelines. Offer interviews or news briefings to answer any questions. Remind voters of existing security and monitoring processes that are already in place Reiterate that regardless of how a ballot is received, it is subjected to verification and confirmation

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Planning Phase	Steps to Consider
	Incident Response : Prepare a media response plan for any incidents involving overzealous observers. Be ready to issue statements and hold news conferences if necessary to address the situation and reassure the public.
	Transparency and Accountability : Emphasize the importance of transparency and accountability in your communications with the media. Ensure that any information shared is accurate and up-to-date.

Managing Drop Box Observers Sample News Release Template



These generic news release templates are a starting point. The first is meant to be released before the election, to provide guidance on the rules in place for ballot box observers. The second can be used in response to incidents related to drop box observers. These are customizable for your jurisdiction. The **Blue text** notes places where jurisdiction specific text is particularly important. It's a best practice to keep news releases to one page or two at most.

Pre-Election Guidance for Ballot Box Observers

- 4. Adherence to Rules: Observers must follow all local, state, and federal laws regarding election observation. Any violation of these rules may result in removal from the observation area and potential legal consequences.

Incident Involving Drop Box Observer

Members of our community are allowed to observe the voting process and ballot drop-off process. However, we have guidelines in place for observers to ensure that everyone stays safe, comfortable, and can participate in the election process.

Guidelines for Observers:

- 1. Maintain Distance: Observers must keep a respectful distance from the ballot drop box to avoid any intimidation or interference with voters.
